This funding will be used to

- Increase our percentage of students attaining an A-C grade in English to 70%
- Continue to support all staff and students by reducing the number of behaviour referrals and SDAs by up to 40%
- Continue to implement the Australian Curriculum from Prep to year 6
- Create an expert teaching team through continual coaching throughout 2021
- Continue to be an active member in the Barna Jarjums Early Years Network to foster and maintain strong, close links with neighbouring schools, child care centres and key local support agencies.
- Provide ongoing professional development opportunities for all staff at Kingston SS throughout 2021
- Implement a 0.5 re-engagement teacher – working with and supporting our Tier 3 behaviour and highly at risk of disengagement students

Our initiatives include

- Train all staff associated with children in Prep – Year 3 in Heggerty's Phonemic Awareness Curriculum. This curriculum will be implemented in every Prep – Year 2 classroom from week 1, Term 1 – throughout 2021. Heggerty's Phonemic Awareness Curriculum is approved by Ed QLD and training is delivered by QASSP
- Implement the new Kingston SS pedagogical framework throughout 2021
- Continue to implement the "Clarity" parameters as we continue to work with the Leading Learning Collaborative (Sth East Region) and Dr Lyn Sharratt
- Continue the Case Management process as a part of our work with "Clarity"
- Implement the "Pause Program" to aid in the wellbeing of all students – EQ initiative
- Continue to work with Early Years Coach to support our staff and students in Prep-Year 2 in collaboration with 3 other neighbouring schools
- Reinvigoration of the KSS PBL team to support all students at Kingston SS
- Continue to focus on teaching social skills and the Zones of Regulation
- Continue to focus on improving attendance to reach and maintain our goal of 90% attendance
- Continue to build strong links with local Indigenous community, Pasific Islander community and local community agencies that support Kingston State School including; Queensland Police Service, Communities for Children - The Salvation Army, Kingston East Neighbourhood Group, Mob Kinnectors, Logan Together, local childcare providers, Bunnings, YMCA, Logan Rotary, The Fathering Project and Be You




